The Trustees of Penarth Arts & Crafts Ltd are pleased to offer a number of rare art works at an auction at the Washington Gallery from April 14.

The works have been brought in from many private collections and from the Washington Gallery's own holdings of paintings from the Stanley Hall Cox Bequest and the Arts Council of Wales.

Of special interest are a rare watercolour by Kyffin Williams from 1973 chosen by the former Keeper of Art at the National Library of Wales, a work by the French Fauvist Charles Camoin (circa 1920), a large watercolour by Thomas Thomas of Yellowstone Park USA, a print made by the former Beatles member, John Lennon and a 1st World War engraving by Pierre Monsard given to a Welsh nurse during her service in northern France nearly a century ago.

Other lots include two works by the Bloomsbury Group painter Duncan Grant, an unusual depiction of Cardiff Dock by Arthur Miles circa 1950 and an impressive oil painting from George Ayling.

Contemporary Welsh artists are well represented with entries by Ivor Davies, Donald McIntyre, Harry Holland, Sue Williams, Emrys Williams, Dewi Tudur and John Selway. A painted table by Neale Howells is among the lots for sale.

Buyers are invited to submit bids until 6pm on April 28; progress of the bids can be reviewed throughout the auction and winning bids announced on April 29.
